**THE TRUE KINGSHIP OF JESUS CHRIST**

What kind of King is Jesus? How do you envision him? Remembering that they were promised a king from the line of David, the Israelites hoped for a Messiah who would set their political problems aright and bring about a worldly kingdom of Judaic power. Even Psalm 122 seems to describe this type of ruler. Luke's Gospel today shreds that image after the whip of the Roman soldiers tore at Jesus' flesh. Still, the Romans flaunted the traditional notion with their ironic inscription above King Jesus' crown of thorns. Soldiers and ordinary people jeered the royal title at him. Yet the throne of Jesus was the cross of Christ, from which he dispensed kingly mercy and justice toward the humble criminal who shared his execution. Writing to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes the truth about Jesus and his kingship, using words like fullness, peace, and forgiveness. So let us go rejoicing!



#### SAN PASQUAL

San Pasqual was born in Torrehermosa, Spain in the kingdom of Aragon on May 24, 1540 on the Feast of Pentecost called in Spain "the Pasch (or "Passover") of the Holy Ghost," hence the name Paschal. He was a mystic and contemplative, and he had frequent visions and spent many nights in prayer before the altar. He is noted for his kindness to the poor and his devotion to the mysteries of the Church, especially the Eucharist.

When just a child, he worked as a shepherd and taught himself to read with the help of some of the townspeople. He joined the Reformed Franciscan Order around 1564. He was devoted to the poor, and though a bowl of broth was the standard handout to the poor who came to the monks for sustenance, he would cook a pot of cabbage, add bread and meat and give it to the poor believing they deserved more than leftovers.

San Pasqual was a simple Franciscan monk devoted to the Holy Eucharist. He was assigned duties in the monastery's kitchen. He was known for making wonderful meals with the simple foods that he found in his humble kitchen. As he cooked, his fellow friars would see him meditating or praying and believed he had the help of angels to assist him in his daily tasks. He is considered the patron saint of cooks and kitchens. San Pasqual died on May 17, 1592 which is his current feast day.

There are bookmarks bearing the image of San Pasqual in the gathering space. They were made by the mother of a parishioner. Please take one as you leave Church today.
